Our Community:

Kids United OSC is a non-profit before and after school club serving the parents & children of Penwortham Primary School. We established the club in 1999. As a Charity we keep our fees as low as possible making Kids United OSC accessible to all parents/guardians.

Our opening times are 7-30 in the morning and we close at 6pm every school night. Our fees for term 2023/2024 are £4 per morning session and £6.56 per evening session.

We are situated in Priory Academy HEX building and have fantastic facilities - a large room for indoor play such as games, colouring/ craft work, table top games, pool table, Construction games a Switch computer and TV and homework/reading support.



We have daily use of the schools indoor Gym as well as fantastic outdoor facilities including the school Muga (multi use games area) and school playing field all of which is totally secure with only staff having fob access. We provide fruit/toast in the mornings and healthy options of snacks in the evening with all dietary needs catered for. We also provide after school activity pick up so you child/children can attend any school provided activities.
